- d. Cumulative GPA: 3.3, ROTC GPA: 4.0
- e. ROTC achievements:
 - Selected to be a member of the Ranger Challenge team, the ROTC programs most elite Cadets, for the past 3 years
 - Served as Platoon Sergeant for Fall semester and Peer Advisor/Assistant Instructor during the Spring semester of SY14/15
 - Consistently scores 295 and above on the Army APFT, earning the Army Physical Fitness badge
 - Has been voted as one of the top 3 cadets in his class by his peers for the last 3 Years.
 - Completed the Army Basic Airborne School while a cadet
 - Completed a Cultural Understanding and Language Proficiency program in China during the summer of between his Sophomore and Junior year
 - Consistently demonstrates the leadership and tactical skills that set him far above his peer group
 - Earned a slot to attend the Sabalauski Air Assault School's Air Assault course during the Summer of 2015
 - Was awarded a scholarship his sophomore year for highest physical fitness score in the battalion
